
A Spiritual Symposium

Fr. John R. Siberski SJ, MD

The first talk entitled "Medication and Aging: An Increasingly Difficult Terrain to Navigate," will consider the problem of polypharmacy in the elderly. The treatment of certain serious symptoms that occur in the elderly particularly that of insomnia, and the increasingly dangerous challenges of over-the-counter, herbal, and "natural" medications, a Wild West of unregulated nostrums will be discussed.

The second talk, "I Did Not Forget Thee O Jerusalem: Memory, Mood, Dementia and the Spiritual Life," will examine some of the challenges that the individual and family confront at the onset of Alzheimer's or another dementing illness as well as through its progression.
